On "Explorer: The West Virginia History Database, Jefferson County Module" CD-Rom, there was an article entitled "Excavations on High Street: The Archaeology of an Historic Neighborhood in Shepherdstown, West Virginia" by Charles A. Hulse. This study was submitted to the Department of Housing and Urban Development in Charleston, WV May 15, 1995 in conjunction with excavations done prior to construction of a new science building on the Shepherd College Campus in Shepherdstown, WV. The study examined four historic residential lots containing remnants of houses built between 1770 and 1855. One of the lots, (Lot 58), involved JACOB VANDEVEER as owner of the property. Jefferson County was part of Berkeley County until 1802. Both were once part of Frederick county, Virginia. Shepherdstown's original name was Mecklenburg.

As known residents, other owners of the property are likewise elusive. Jacob Vandever listed as out-of-state address as Bedminster Township, Somerset County, New Jersey, in 1771, suggesting he was an absentee landlord at that time. His granddaughter, Femetje, and her husband, Clarkson Freeman, listed Mercer County, Kentucky, as their residence in the 1802 sale to Adam Myers, (Deed Book 1, p. 191, Jefferson Co.) The Vandever family also had large land holdings in Berkeley County in the late 18th century, but actual residence for family members are purely conjectural. The will of Jacob Vandever dated Oct. 2, 1772, (Will Book 1, p. 14, Frederick Co.), states: 1) "to grandson Jacob, son of my son Joseph deceased, the home and lot in Virginia in Mecklinburg which bought of Thomas Thornburg" and 2) "to granddaughter Femetje land bought of Chapline joining Jacobs."

Guisbert Sutphen lived on a farm lying half a mile north of the Larger Cross Roads, which is now owned and occupied by his great-grandson, Amos Sutphen. With his wife, Ariontje Van Pelt, he had entered the township in 1743, travelling with their children and household goods in an ox-cart from Monmouth county, where his father, also named Guisbert, had settled early in the century. When it was decided to build Bedminster church, differences of opinion arose as to the location. Both Sutphen and Van der Veer offered liberal inducements to have the building placed at points of their selection. Mr. Sutphen's choice was for the vicinity of the Larger Cross Roads, but eventually Mr. Van der Veer's views prevailed, and the new structure was erected on the site of the present edifice below the village of the Lesser Cross Roads, or Bedminster. The first minute of the new congregation was made by Mr. Hardenbergh in the Raritan church books on Christmas, 1758.... It is probable that the church was erected in that or the following year. Two acres of land were donated by Jacobus Van der Veer, who also furnished fifty pounds sterling and one-third of all the oak timber. The same amount of money, together with one-half of the oak necessary for the frame, was the gift of Guisbert Sutphen.(130)

Henry Van Derveer or Vanderveer, physician, was born in 1791, in Roycefield, Somerset County, N.J., the son of Lawrence Van Derveer, founder of the Medical Society of New Jersey. Van Derveer was educated as a child in the academy at Somerville, N.J., graduated from Princeton in 1811, and matriculated at the Department of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania from 1813-1815, but did not graduate. Returning home, Van Derveer set up practice in Roycefield and subsequently in Somerville.

Van Derveer was active in the medical societies of New Jersey, serving on the Board of Censors of the District Medical Society of Somerset County and presiding as President of the Medical Society of New Jersey in 1836.

Shortly after returning from Philadelphia Van Derveer married Mary Ann Frelinghuysen, eldest daughter of General John Frelinghuysen. On 13 Feb. 1874, Van Derveer died in Somerset County, N.J.
